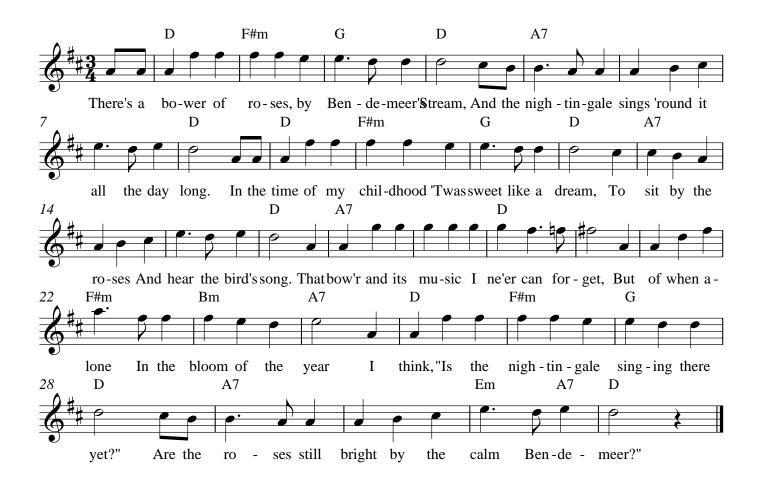
Bendemeer's Stream
